

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

This chapter is about Introduction of the study. It consists of Background of the study, Problem Statement, The Objectives of the Study, and Significant of the Study.

A. Background of the Study

At the moment, we can easily watch the movie that adapted from the book. A book that created into the movie is usually bestseller, has a great story, events and setting. When the book is, create to the movie, many people curious about the inclusion that the books have. Does the imagination, scene, character that appeared in the book also same as in movie or not. As the title you can see, this proposed research will discuss the preference of book to the movie version. Khaled Hosseini was born in Kabul in 1965. Due to a coup by the communist group of PPDA and SAUR Revolution in 1978, Hosseini and his family could not return to Afghanistan. Within a year after the Soviet Invasion of Afghanistan, Hosseini and his family granted political asylum from the American government and permanently settled in San Jose California. Hosseini is a doctor who also renowned novelist because of his monumental work, *The Kite Runner*, and *The Thousand Splendid Suns*. Both of the novels have translated into various languages and sold over 38 million copies worldwide. Graduated from medical education in California-San Diego, Khaled Hosseini opened a specialist organ practice in 1996 and began writing his first novel, that is *The Kite Runner* in 2004. The efficiency and the accurateness of Hosseini made this novel succeeded in mesmerizing many readers until this novel published in more than 70

countries. For his success, Hosseini was appointed as UNHCR representative as Goodwill Envoy.

Marc Forster is come from German and well known as a filmmaker and screenwriter. Forster has been successfully directing the films like *Monster's Ball* (2001), *Finding Neverland* (2006), *Stay* (2005), *Stranger than Fiction* (2006), *The Kite Runner* (2007), *Quantum of Solace* (2008), and *World War Z* (2013). In the film of *Monster's Ball* (2001), Foster directed Halle Berry an Academy Award-winning performance. Moreover, the film of *Finding Neverland* (2004) nominated for five Golden Globe Awards and seven Academy Awards, belonging to Johnny Deep as a Best Picture and Best Actor.

The Kite Runner is a story two young boys were lived in a shared household in Kabul. One is Amir, a son of a wealthy businessman and another boy is Hassan, a son of businessman's servant. They were so close and talented to play a game of kite running. The story continues into Amir's betrayal who let Hassan be a victim of a rape from Asef and the gang. After that, Amir and his Baba moved into America cause of Taliban regime in Afghanistan. In many years later, Amir got a call in California from Baba's old family friend to explain that Hassan died cause the Taliban and Hassan' son became sex slaves by Taliban forces. At the end of the story is Amir rescue Hassan'son, Sohrab, as a redemption to Hassan. Then, Amir adopted Sohrab and lives in the United States.

There is some reason why researcher chooses *The Kite Runner* movie as an object of this research. First, this movie is about a betrayed friendship who make some moviegoers get a life lesson. Moviegoers will know how we should behave to the person who is willing to sacrifice for us. When people sacrifice to us, then we should know how to reply it.

Second, the movie showed an Afghanistan culture. The culture of Afghanistan such as a game of kite running, the building, and the clothes makes this film amazing. The most prominent culture that featured in this film is the tradition of chasing the kite. This tournament is very prestigious and followed enthusiastically by the whole society.
