#### INTRODUCTION

He is the writer with the highest number of social media followers reaching over 29.5 million fans through his Facebook page and 12.2 million followers on Twitter. The Winner Stands Alone is set in the exciting worlds of fashion and cinema. Taking place over the course of twenty-four hours during the Cannes Film Festival, it is the story of Igor, a successful, driven Russian entrepreneur who will go to the darkest lengths to reclaim a lost love - his ex-wife, Ewa. Believing that his life with Ewa was divinely ordained, Igor once told her that he would destroy whole worlds to get her back. The conflict between an individual evil force and society emerges, and as the novel unfolds, morality is derailed.

The story takes place in twenty for hours in the Film Festival Cannes, French. It supposed to happen in the month of May. Where there were thousands of interesting and famous people around the world gather to appreciate many kinds of films. In Cannes, there are so many people

with different background and motives. They have dreams to be the people in the status "Superclass". Coelho's term for people of Power. "The Superclass, "he says, "rules the world; their arguments are subtle, their voices soft, their smile discreet, but their decision are final. In Cannes, the Superclass is consisted of film, fashion, money and fame. Igor, the main character feels that this is the right time to have action as what he planned six months earlier. He is so obsessed to get her ex-wife in his arm again. He flew from Russia to French with his own jet plane, only for one mission to take his wife back, whom already married with famous designer from Middle East, Hamid Husein. Igor will do anything to fulfill his obsession including ends someone's life Throughout the day, he killed seven people without any feeling of guilt. He chose his victims randomly. He sent a message through mobile phone with hidden number to his exwife each time he just murdered a man and told her that he has destroyed someone's world. But Ewa seems indifferent since she was always near with her husband, but indeed she was very anxious. She knows who sent the message. Yet, she knows exactly who Igor is (she spent almost twenty years live with him). She knows that her ex-husband is a person with mental illness. At the end of his adventure, he ended Ewa's and Hamid's life and felt that he was the winner. The star-studded film festival acts as a backdrop to Igor's maniacal murdering spree and we are introduced to various characters along the way, all of whom are desperately trying to get their big break in the shallow world of show business; Gabriela a young

and naive actress who is being exploited by her agent and Jasmine a troubled young Rwandan refugee working as a model. The Winner Stands Alone is a gripping, fast-paced thriller, and Coelho cleverly weaves in elements of social satire, poking fun at our celebrity and money obsessed culture. (Ibnu Rosid Afandi:2014)

Paolo Coelho as a novelist viewed and portrayed this phenomena into his work of art. He tried to critize his society he lived in through his novel. Coelho disapproves mightily of the human folly on display in Cannes: the unbridled ambition, the thirst for fame, the lure of haute couture and ostentatious jewelry. He hates dark glasses, because "in a celebrity town like Cannes, [they] are synonymous with status," and he loathes cellphones, which are "leading the world into a state of utter madness." He posits a small group of people whom he dubs the "superclass," who have all the power, all the limos, all the private jets; those who dress in high fashion (the fashion world is one of his principal bugaboos), swill champagne, drive Maybachs (the finest car) and who, if they're women, get regular injections of Botox. But he isn't fond of ordinary people either, who do silly things like wear neckties or eat three meals a day whether they're hungry or not. (Carolyn See. www.the washingtonpost.com.2009)
