CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

A. Background of Study

Novel is a portrait of reality, manifested through the aesthetic language due to its contact with human life. In this case, the author is tasked with conveying the intent and purpose of telling to the reader through his work. Ratna (2010) argues that novel provides the most extensive media so that the author has the broadest possibility to convey a message to the reader. One of the ways in which the author conveys his intentions is through the appearance of the characters who are the focus of the story.

Interesting phenomenon of recent years is the emergence of a number of authors that are presented through works with psychological themes. Trauma is a very common thing in psychology. It is a psychological problem that always gets special attention among psychologists. It closely related to one's mental and emotional health.

Trauma is not something new in literature. There are many literary works that also use this psychological problem as a theme. *Sidney Sheldon's After the Darkness* is one of the examples. In this study, the researcher discusses the trauma experienced by the character, Grace Brookstein in *Sidney Sheldon's novel After the Darkness*.

This novel tells the story of Grace Brookstein who lives like a princess with a luxurious lifestyle in spite of the fall of economy crisis in the US. One day, her husband who is a billionaire from the Quorum company, Lenny, mysteriously disappeared in a tragic sailing accident. Lenny's death was finally reported as a suicide. After the death of her husband, the \$ 75 billion Quorum protected fund also disappeared. Everyone believes that Grace stole the money.

After that, Grace was sentenced to prison for money laundering accusations that she did not actually commit. She was then betrayed by her family and friends. She had no one to ask for help and tried to kill herself, but she survived. That's when Grace began to experience a change in attitude from what was originally an innocent young woman to a traumatized person living for revenge.

Events or experiences that are frightening or terrifying will become traumatic for a person. This seems to be reflected in Grace's character. Bad experiences that Grace experienced like; betrayal, loss of a loved one, violence, verbal and sexual harassment, and serious losses (both material and non-material) have had a devastating effect on her. It happened spontaneously in succession. These bad experiences made her unable to control her emotions which ultimately damaged her mental endurance. As a result, she turned into a different person.

Grace can no longer function like a normal person in daily life. She was afraid that the traumatic event she had experienced would recur again. She was afraid of the dangers that could come at her anytime and anywhere like when she was a fugitive. The fear that appears on her in the form of terrible flashbacks and nightmares makes her trapped in the realm of paranoia. She no longer lives in the past or in the present because there will always be something that triggers her traumatic experience.

There are several reasons why the researcher is interested in analyzing this novel. First, *Sidney Sheldon's After the Darkness* is a novel that tells the story of someone's struggle against fear and pain for survival and revenge. So, readers can be motivated to appreciate more the meaning of the process in struggle itself. Second, the novel gives the reader an understanding of the importance of one's mental health and the role of the people around them. So, the reader is able to avoid things that cause mental disorders and also help the recovery of people who suffer from mental illness by means of maintaining a good social relationship with them. And finally, *Sidney Sheldon's After the Darkness* has important elements

for this research such as psychology, post-traumatic stress disorders (PTSD), psychological trauma, etc. that are needed in this research.
