The Movie directed by *Clint Eastwood* is a Movie based on a true story that happened in 2009 with the main character, namely *Sully*. This Movie tells the story of a captain named Sully who works as a pilot at US Airways airlines who is forced to make a landing on the Hudson River in New York, United States. This had to be done because of a flock of birds crashing into the aircraft engine. In this incident, there were no fatalities. Captain Sully landed his plane in the middle of the Hudson River, and even this tragedy was nicknamed "*The Miracle on the Hudson*". In this Movie, Eastwood adds some humorous lines to captivate the audience. This Movie is interesting because of the controversial presentation of the causes of the accident in the NTSB version. Almost all research researchers reveal the possibility of "Pilot Error", Captain Sully also firmly said that this was the right decision he took to save all his passengers. NTSB investigators also revealed that it was possible to make landings at La Guardia Airport or Teterboro Airport near Newyork City.
