CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

A. Background Of The Study

Every human being has goals and ambitions. Humans need the help of other people to achieve a goal because humans are social beings. Cruella was directed by Craig Gillespie, he is an Australian-American director. He was born in Sydney, New South Wales, Australia on September 1, 1967. Gillespie is a film, commercial, and television director. Gillespie has made seven films, and his best-known directing films are Lars and the Real Girl (2007), Fright Night (2011), I, Tonya (2017), and Cruella (2021). He began his career as a director when he signed a contract with Coppos Films and worked as a commercial director. Gillespie's debut film as a film director was "Mr. Woodcock" (2007), but he left the project after a negative test screening and many re-shot and re-written scenes. Then, he was replaced by David Dobkin. (Internet Movie Database)

For his next film, Gillespie was announced as the director to rework the remake of "Fright Night" (2010), with the main actors being Colin Farrell, Toni Collette, and Anton Yelchin. Tom Holland previously directed this 1985 American supernatural horror film in his directorial debut. This film tells the story of a teenager named Charly Brewster and a vampire neighbor named Jerry Dandrige. The next movie, "I, Tonya" (2017), saw Gillespie work on a documentary about the career and life of Tonya Harding, an American figure skater. This film stars Margot Robbie, Allison Janney, and Sebastian Stan. Gillespie was allowed to direct Disney's liveaction spin-off film "Cruella" (2021) from One Hundred and One Dalmatians, replacing Alexander. She is a creative and talented woman who wants to achieve her dream of becoming a famous fashion designer, but a series of events makes her reveal her evil side and become cruel and vengeful. Walt Disney Pictures released this film on May 18, 2021, in Los Angeles, United States. The duration of the film is 134 minutes. This film was released theatrically by Walt Disney Motion Pictures and was available on the Disney+ premium application on May 28, 2021. This film was released digitally by Walt Disney Studios Home Entertainment on June 25, 2021, and Blu-ray, Ultra HD Blu-ray, and DVD on September 21, 2021. At the United States and Canada box office, the film's five-week gross was \$86.1 million, its gross from other territories was \$147.4 million, and the worldwide box office total was \$233.5 million. Cruella was nominated for 43 Academy Awards and won 27 among them. The category that has won the most is Best Costume Design (Jenny Beavan) from the Academy Awards, BAFTA Awards, Critics Choice Awards, CDG Awards, Las Vegas Film Critics Society Awards, SDFCS Awards, SLFCA Awards, OFTA Film Award, INOC Awards, Gold Derby Awards, LEJA Award, HCA Award, DFC Award, NDFS Award, CIC Award. The second category that received many wins was Film Music (Nicholas Britell), which was obtained from the BMI Film & TV Awards,

World Soundtrack Awards, and IFMCA Awards. Hollywood Makeup Artist and Hair Stylist Guild Awards for the category Best Period and Character Makeup-Feature-Length Motion Picture, People's Choice Awards for the category The Drama Movie of 2021. NFCA Award and LEJA Award for the category Best Hair and Makeup. BFDG Award for Best Production Design category. HFCS Award for Best Makeup category. HCA Award for Best Supporting Actress category. MMI Award for category Best Score for a Comedy Film. (Internet Movie Database)

Several critical responses have been given to this film. Based on reviews from the Rotten Tomatoes site, which accounted for 75% of the 414 reviews from top critics, the film *Cruella* received quite a positive response. In contrast to Rotten Tomatoes, the San Francisco Chronicle reviewer Mick LaSalle criticized the film *Cruella* as prioritizing style over substance. He called the film's writing "careless," although Mick praised Thompson's performance, soundtrack, and costume design. Anthony Oliver Scott from the New York Times said that this film is easy to watch but tends to be difficult to care about. He also noted that the purpose of the film is to remind people of old movies and watch them again. Even though the film Cruella has yet to be universally acclaimed, this film got a rating of 7.4% on IMDb.

Cruella tells about a child's ambition for revenge for the death of her beloved mother. In 1964, Estella was considered different since she was a baby because she had different hair, black and white. Estella grew up as a genius, brave, confident, and creative child. She is interested in the world of fashion. She feels that there is another personality within her who has an evil side called Cruella, which her mother Catherine doesn't like. Estella meets Anita and a dog named Buddy, who becomes her friends. Catherine withdrew Estella from school due to her mischief and decided to make a new start in London. Catherine gives Estella a red necklace. Unfortunately, Estella had to see Catherine die when they attended a party held at Hellman Hall.

When Estella arrived in London alone, she met two thiefs, Horace and Jasper, they became friends until they're adults. Estella had a friend who was a boutique keeper named Artie. On the other hand, Estella wants to work as a famous designer. Estella managed to work at Liberty of London as a cleaning service with Jasper's help. However, she had trouble and luckily got a job at the Baroness's place. Because of her potential, Estella became the Baroness' trusted designer until she saw that the Baroness was wearing her mother Catherine's necklace. She plans to take the necklace back with the help of Jasper, Horace, Anita, and Artie but failed. Estella also discovered that the Baroness had killed her mother. Estella decides to take revenge for the death of her mother, Catherine, by disrupting the Baroness' fashion show.

There are three reasons why the writer chose *Cruella* as research. The first reason, there is inspiring story from the figure of Estella. Even though Cruella is a movie with the main role as the antagonist, somebody can learn several positive lessons in life. For example, the intention to change life for the better is shown in the movie when Estella loses her mother, and she is bored of being a thief; she can use her potential correctly. Estella tries hard to pursue her dream of becoming a designer, and when she works with the Baroness, she tries hard to live a better life. It is a lesson not to give up on life. Everyone certainly has their own problems. In the movie, when Estella loses the only family she had, she chooses to continue her journey to London without her mother, Catherine, until she meets friends who become her new family. Moreover, even though the movie Cruella is about revenge, various clothes used in this film can inspire designers to create more unique designs.

The second reason is that the appearance of actress Emma Stone as Estella/Cruella, is considered successful in playing her role. Viewers can enjoy the character of Cruella in the films 101 Dalmatians and 102 Dalmatians with *Cruella* without any significant differences, especially with better cinematics. Emma Stone did a great job portraying the characters

of Cruella and Estella, which made the audience feel various emotions for this film
